Professional Judgment

Academy of Massage and Bodywork will consider making a Professional Judgement on a case-by-case basis for either Special Circumstances and/or Unusual Circumstances.

Examples of Special Circumstances include:

- Change in employment status, income, or assets.
- Change in housing status (e.g., homelessness)
- Tuition expenses at an elementary or secondary school
- Medical, dental, or nursing home expenses not covered by insurance.
- Child or dependent care expenses
- Severe disability of the student or other member of the student's household

The above list is not an exhaustive list.

- Other changes or adjustments that impact on the student's costs or ability to pay for college.
- Or appropriate, reasonable adjustments to reflect a student's situation more accurately.

Upon justification and proper documentation, the Financial Aid Administrator may adjust data elements in the Cost of Attendance or in the EFC calculation.

Examples of Unusual Circumstances include:

- Human trafficking, as described in the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C 7101 et seq.).
- Legally granted refugee or asylum status.
- Parental abandonment or estrangement; or
- Student or parental incarceration.

In such cases an override might be warranted based upon the student's individual circumstances. These conditions would also not disqualify a student from being a homeless unaccompanied youth or self-supporting and at risk of homelessness.

However, none of the conditions listed below, singly or in combination, qualify as unusual circumstances meriting a dependency override.

Unusual Circumstances do not include:

- Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education.
- Parents will not provide information for the FAFSA or verification.
- Parents do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes.
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency.
